




## Local Golf Course Accolade

Ku-ring-gai Council's golf course at North Turramurra has received an accolade from Australia's golfers. The 6th hole at the golf course has been nominated through a poll as the best in Australia. The poll hosted by Inside Golf Australia found that North Turramurra's 6th hole was nominated as the best example of a "fantastic risk-reward hole that challenges golfers of all levels." The praise comes as North Turramurra's championship standard golf course was extensively remodelled in 2017.

Ku-ring-gai Council is trialling two types of asphalt made from up to 35% recycled waste including plastic bags, glass and green waste. In doing so, Ku-ring-gai has become one of the first councils in Australia to take on the challenge of turning waste into useful by-products such as road asphalt and bitumen.

"If the trials are successful, both products could provide an avenue for local government to recycle waste which increasingly can no longer be processed overseas," said Ku-ring-gai Mayor Jennifer Anderson.




## Local Elderly At-Risk of Flu

Residents who have family in aged-care are being urged by NSW Health to ensure they are vaccinated against the flu before visiting facilities. Ku-ring-gai has one of the largest densities of aged-care facilities, meaning the need to get the jab is of even more importance to locals.

"Elderly people often have conditions that are aggravated by influenza. It is not too late to get vaccinated, we want to remind people that the flu vaccine is still the best protection," NSW Health Director of Communicable Diseases said.

## The New Heart of Ryde



"It ticks all the boxes. There is the opportunity for The New Heart of Ryde to be a one-stop shop for the community."





# Chatswood Parking Finder

hatswood Parking Finder displays satellite imagery of Chatswood CBD, with all council car parks marked in different colours. Drivers can filter results by entering their intended time of arrival, how long they plan to stay and where they wish to park.

The site shows users where to find street parking; motorbike, car share and disabled spaces; taxi zones and off-street parking, as well as distinguishing between free and paid spaces. School zones, no stopping, drop-off and loading areas are also marked on the map.

The website is available for free and Mayor Gail Giles-Gidney encourages visitors to try it. The service is offered in the hopes of making journeys more efficient and direct.

"By giving drivers access to a simple, colour-coded map, they know exactly where and when they can park legally at any time of the day – it will help drivers avoid fines as well."

The website will be on trial until the end of August. The council will collect transport data to determine its effectiveness in reducing congestion.



# **Boost Your Tax Return**

t is that time of year again - tax! The coming months are known for brisk weather and the tedious task of lodging tax returns. Sydney Observer had the chance to sit down with Director of Tax Communications at H&R Block, Mark Chapman, who shares how to get the most from your money.

#### **CLAIM WHAT YOU ARE ENTITLED TO:**

"If you have spent something as part of your work, and you have the paperwork to prove it, claim it," says Mark. Common deductions include the costs of using your own car for work, travelling for work and the cost of tools and equipment. A trusty tax accountant will be able to tell you exactly what you can and cannot claim, minimising the chances of an audit down the track. But make sure not to stretch the truth! "You can only claim what you've spent, so do not inflate deductions in order to get a bigger refund."

#### **DO NOT RELY ON ATO PRE-FILLED DATA:**

You can pre-fill lots of your income information straight from the ATO's systems. However, Mark warns our readers not to assume that this income data is correct or complete. "Always use your own information as the key source data. Many third parties, such as banks, will not pass your information to the ATO until August so early lodgers will often find lots of data missing from their pre-fill."

#### **GET TRUSTED GUIDANCE:**

The consequence of making an error on your tax return falls back onto you, either with a lower refund or ATO penalties. H&R Block data has shown that 74% of Australians find it far less stressful to leave it to an agent to complete their return. This ensures an accurate and complete tax return. "An experienced agent will usually be good at sniffing out obscure tax deductions you did not know you could claim. Best of all, the tax agent's fee is deductible."

"School holidays are over and parents are enrolling children in activities for the



# **Combustible Cladding** Saga Hits Home

• o the dismay of locals who recently entered into the apartment property market, cases of combustible cladding have been reported throughout the North Shore and its surrounds. The story broke recently that over 1400 buildings across the Sydney basin have been identified by Local Government Areas (LGA) to potentially contain combustible cladding. The LGA found that 30 buildings in Ku-ring-gai, 60 buildings in Willoughby, 10 buildings in Hornsby, 17 buildings in Ryde and 18 buildings in Mosman were at risk. Neighbouring council areas Lane Cove and Hunters Hill declined to disclose their figures.

Sydney Observer reached out to two local councils to see if combatting this particular issue is on the agenda for its councillors. A spokesperson from Willoughby City Council noted that a proactive investigation had taken place, and that the buildings were identified in collaboration with Fire and Rescue NSW and the Department of Planning and Environment.

"Following the investigation, eight buildings have been issued orders for cladding removal and replacement. The state government is investigating state-owned properties within the local government area such as hospitals and train stations."

A similar sentiment was echoed by Kuring-gai Council's spokesperson, stating that an audit was part of a "coherent and robust regulatory regime."

"As a result, the government has written to building owners whom they consider may need to take some investigative action on their external wall cladding. These building owners have also been required to register their buildings with the NSW Government. Ku-ring-gai Council has adopted a standard condition of approval placed on appropriate development consents, that specifically highlights the need for external walls of buildings and their attachments to comply with the National Construction Code."

The wall cladding of concern is made from aluminium composite panels. The concern with aluminium panels is that the material has a higher susceptibility for rapid vertical spread of fire along multilevel complexes.



# Take Advantage of Local Libraries

• ar gone are the traditional libraries that only hold books - our local North Shore libraries are increasingly becoming hubs for interaction, education and community. Newspapers can be accessed, free new release DVD's, books and magazines, big print books designed for those hard of seeing, internet access, toy dispensaries and more. These are just a few of the countless educational resources on offer. President of Local Government NSW Linda Scott stressed the importance of funding for local libraries.

"NSW public libraries are visited by more than 34.8 million people each year, compared to the average 3.1 million who visit the Svdnev Cricket Ground, Allianz and ANZ stadiums combined. Our council-run libraries operate as important community and literacy hubs, both in rural and regional NSW and in metropolitan areas. They are open to everyone and are free, offering a wide range of services. Recently the NSW

Government responded to our 'Renew Our Libraries' campaign with a \$60 million funding commitment over four years. That is a great first step but our libraries face a funding crisis due to decades of underinvestment," Ms Scott said.

t a recent Chapel service in my school, all the students -Kindergarten to Year 12 – were encouraged with a challenge:

You have something important to say in your generation.

That challenge was given in the context of one of our Year 12 students, Elvice Ikuo, having her award-winning poem – 'In my language they call me Ume Ibiegi', about the plight of the hunted Bird of Paradise - included in a new National Library publication in between iconic poems by Judith Wright and Dorothea Mackellar. There should be channels of opportunity for our students to express important messages to our future culture with grace and sometimes, eloquent poignancy.

An ancient scripture says that 'faith without works is dead'. Similarly, words

So, at the conclusion of NAIDOC week this year, our Year 10 students led our school community in a mission to a remote NSW border town on the Macintyre River, with the aim of completing the Oasis Ministries Centre for the benefit of Indigenous communities in and around Boggabilla. They slept rough and toiled long hours under the expert guidance of volunteer tradies, alongside some new Aboriginal friends. They spent their holidays and \$30,000 raised in contributions from willing donors on a goodwill enterprise

# **Global Maths** Conference in Sydney

he largest international conference for mathematics education will be hosted by Sydney, with the support of the Federal and NSW Government. Over 2,800 mathematics educators, researchers and teachers are expected to attend the eight-day International Congress on Mathematical Education (ICME) in 2024.

The news comes as Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) related subjects are at an all-time high in NSW school curriculums. A recent survey conducted by Youth Insight found that 46% of young people surveyed are considering studying STEM-related subjects in the future and 31% are considering STEM-related job roles. Women are also part of these statistics, marking major growth in a national bid to balance out unequal representations of gender in the industry.

Australia's Chief Scientist Dr Alan Finkel AO agreed that hosting the win was very timely.

"At all levels of government, it is well understood that a workforce skilled in mathematics is critical to our future. Hosting events such as this will help to elevate the ambition of students and educators," Dr Finkel said.

"Our Government's ongoing investment and focus on STEM education is designed to ensure all students have access to the building blocks of learning that maths and science gives them," stated Federal Minister for Education Dan Tehan.

## North Shore Schools Expo



Designed by Dr Hamid Abdi and Masters Students Jayadev Ajayakumar, Naga Venkata Durga, Surendra Anna and Lahiru Abeysekara, the bag has built-in hardware and software, which determines if it has been correctly packed for each day's schedule.

Items are detected in the bag with radio frequency identification (RFID) tags, while the Internet of things (IOT) technology is used to check the contents of the bag against the day's plans. If an item is missing, an alert can be sent to parents to notify them.

## Minister Stands by **NAPLAN Review**

The NSW Minister for Education, Sarah Mitchell, remains firm in her push for a review of NAPLAN, despite the proposal not receiving the support of the Education Council.

Ms Mitchell says that governments need to come together and recognise the mounting evidence that NAPLAN should be updated. While she was disappointed by the Council's decision to not support this proposal back in June, Ms Mitchell says she will not be deterred from "ensuring there is an appropriate diagnostic test in place for students, teachers and parents right across NSW."

"NSW will work with other states including Victoria and Queensland to progress the review and bring recommendations back to the Council," she says.

According to Ms Mitchell, in 2019 a diagnostic test is something that should be available on-demand, linked to the curriculum and focused on student growth.

"Reforming our diagnostic testing regime is not a new concept; between 1982 and 1995 we had the Basic Skills Test, and in 2008 we adopted NAPLAN," Ms Mitchell said. "We are always seeking to improve the numeracy and literacy outcomes of our students. But Governments also have a responsibility to improve the tools we use to measure these outcomes."

Ms Mitchell will be meeting with stakeholders to ensure there is a collaborate approach in place to further push for the reforms.

It can also tell when items are not needed, therefore reducing the weight of the bag and the discomfort children may experience when carrying heavy items.

"We know packing the schoolbag each morning can be difficult, especially for younger kids, because the timetable changes daily and each day they need to pack different things," Dr Abdi says.

"We think the smart schoolbag will save a lot of time and stress that occurs when homework, hats or lunches are left at home by mistake, especially if that requires parents to quickly race home to collect the missing item."

The system can be fitted into any schoolbag, but Dr Abdi has designed a prototype, which includes the smart phone application. It is expected to retail for between \$125 and \$150.



# The History of Our Home

he name St Ives can be attributed to two possible sources: St Ives in Cornwall, or Isaac Ellis Ives, who was a member of the St Leonards Legislative Assembly from 1885-89.


The district was first explored in 1788 by the first Governor of NSW, Arthur Phillip, and his men. They camped at Bungaroo while on expedition, seeking land that could supply the colony with agricultural products, as the soil around the harbour could not support crops.

Daniel Dering Mathew was the area's first landowner, arriving in 1812. He was granted access to 800 acres of land in

1823, which he named Rosedale, a name that would be given to the entire district.

Due to its perceived remote location, Rosedale's development was slow. In the 1850's and 60's, it served as a community for orchardists. There was no electricity in the area until 1914 and initially, only one telephone in the post office. Households grew their own fruits and vegetables, some raised poultry and other animals, such as pigs. There was a butcher, a bakery and other local businesses that met the district's needs. The district's main transport route was the dirt track, Stoney Creek Road (now Mona Vale Road). Settlement increased in the late 1890's. During the Second World War, a number of troops were stationed in St Ives. This led to the construction of Archibald Road, an emergency route to the city. Following the war's end, the suburb saw rapid expansion as a steady growth of families moved into the area, and by the 1950's was transforming into a dormitory suburb. With its relatively flat land, St Ives lent itself to residential development and was rezoned from 'rural' to 'residential' in 1959.

Its population grew from under 3000 in 1954 to 18,521 by 1976.



# The Stars of St Ives



## Karl Stefanovic

Born in Darlinghurst, gold Logie award winner Karl Stefanovic studied Journalism at Queensland University of Technology, graduating in 1994. He auditioned at NIDA at his father's suggestion when he could not find a cadetship, but was denied entry. He was finally offered a role working for WIN Television in Rockhampton and Cairns as a cadet reporter later that year.

The following year he met his wife of 21 years, Cassandra Thorburn, at a party. The pair later moved to St Ives, with their three kids. Stefanovic scored a position working for the Nine Network in 2000, and five years later moved onto his most memorable role, as the host of *The Today Show*. Journalism runs in the family, with his younger brother Peter Stefanovic also working as a correspondent for 60 Minutes. In 2010 the family vacated the St Ives home to purchase a 2.3 million home in Lindfield, although the marriage terminated only six years later. Stefanovic remarried at the end of last year to Jasmine Yarbrough in a lavish wedding in Mexico.



## Slim Dusty

Famous Australian country music singer and songwriting legend, Slim Dusty, was born David Gordon Kirkpatrick in Nulla Nulla Creek NSW, near Kempsey, on 13 June 1927. Regarded as the King of Australian Country Music, Dusty changed his name at 11 years old, one year after he had written his first song 'The Way the Cowboy Dies'. Dusty's 70-year music career spans back to the beginning of country music in Australia. He released more than 100 albums and sold more than seven million records.

Moving to St Ives later in life, his legacy remains at the Slim Dusty Enterprises stationed at 32 Bundabah Avenue. He died at his St Ives home in 2013 after a long battle with cancer, leaving behind children Anne and David, and his life long partner and fellow musician, Joy McKean.

## Andrew Denton

Television presenter Andrew Denton grew up in the Kuring-gai area, attending Roseville Primary School before his family relocated to Wentworth Falls, where he attended Blue Mountains Grammar school. He achieved a Bachelor of Communications from Charles Sturt University in 1982 then started working in radio.


He broke into television in the 1987 series *The Investigators* and moved onto hosting various televisions shows, notably *Enough Rope* and the ABC game show *Randling*. Denton has authored books and produced documentaries, and is also responsible for discovering The Chaser troupe and signing them with the ABC.

The witty TV personality resides in St Ives with his TV presenter wife, Jennifer Byrne, and their son Connor. He is the co-director of the local pro-euthanasia organisation, Go Gentle, a cause he has advocated since his father's death in 1997.



## Georgie Parker

Home and Away's Georgie Parker was born in 1964 and raised in St Ives. She attended St Ives Public School before transitioning to Abbotsleigh Girls School. The two-time gold Logie award-winning actress is best known for her roles in Australian soap operas, starring as Lucy Gardiner in A Country Practice, Theresa 'Terri' Sullivan in All Saints, and Roo Stewart in Home and Away. In 1999 she married Steve Worland, a screenwriter and novelist, and together they share one child, daughter Holly. The gorgeous screen star has endured a problematic battle with scoliosis and serves as the ambassador of the National Scoliosis Foundation.







## Adam Kellerman

Australian Wheelchair tennis champion Adam Kellerman grew up and resides in St Ives. At 13 he was diagnosed with Ewings Scarcoma, a form of bone cancer, which limited the mobility of his right leg after his right hip was removed because of complications with an infection during treatment. As an active young boy and avid sports player, the illness came as a devastating physical blow.

At age 16 he picked up a racket and began playing wheelchair tennis. Despite his hardship, his determination led him to represent Australia in the London 2012 and Rio 2016 Paralympics, and he is currently ranked as the second-highest Australian player in his class. Kellerman is a motivational speaker off the court and enjoys studying nutrition with plans to pursue it as a career post-tennis.



# **Self-Compassion**

rom time to time we all treat ourselves harshly (for example, by being overly self-critical). This can lead to feelings of anxiety, shame, and sometimes depression. What if we treated ourselves kindly instead? Self-compassion is a concept, developed by Dr Kristen Neff, that includes: being kind to yourself; seeing your mistakes as part of being human (just like everyone else); and viewing your reactions to a situation in an open and balanced way (accepting your behaviour and reactions, rather than getting stuck on your selfcritical thoughts).

My research with Dr Wendy Phillips found that older adults higher in self-compassion were also higher in wellbeing, including having higher levels of happiness and a greater sense that their life has meaning and purpose. Recent research also shows that in older adults, self-compassion was associated with lower anxiety and depression (as it is in other age groups). Older adults higher in self-compassion also cope better than others when they have high stress and poor health, and may do better on some aspects of physical health as well, such as sleep quality. Self-compassion therapy can improve resilience and coping strategies can reduce anxiety and stress.

One technique to boost self-compassion is to:

- Write a letter to yourself about a situation or aspect of yourself that makes you feel insecure or inadequate (we all have them!).
- Write it from the perspective of a good friend.
- Ask yourself what a really supportive, accepting, forgiving friend who loves you would say.
- Give yourself understanding and comfort, just like you would that friend if they were in that situation.

As Kristen Neff states, "Instead of mercilessly judging and criticizing yourself for various inadequacies or shortcomings, use selfcompassion...after all, whoever said you were supposed to be perfect?"

# What is Your Parenting Style?

he relationship we have with our children, the values we signify and the examples we set have the greatest impact on them. Your parenting style can support a child's healthy development and affects a child's selfesteem as it influences how parents interact with their children.

Parents may differ from each other in parenting styles and this may cause conflict and result in inconsistency for the child. Open communication between parents about values and what influences and informs our parenting style is helpful.

#### FOUR PARENTING STYLES:

#### • Authoritative

Parents create a positive relationship, are nurturing and responsive, have high expectations and enforce rules. Parents involve the child in problem-solving, explain the reason behind rules and value the child's opinion. Parents use positive discipline strategies such as praise and rewards to reinforce good behaviour.

**Outcome -** Children have higher selfesteem, report feeling happier, and are good at making decisions and evaluating personal safety and risk.

#### Authoritarian

Parents focus on obedience, are overly strict or harsh and use punishment. Parents lack warmth, can be controlling and enforce consequences with no regard to the child's feelings or opinion.

**Outcome -** Children tend to follow rules but suffer low self-worth, as their opinions aren't valued. Children may become defiant or aggressive and lie to avoid punishment. Children are less likely to take on responsibility and problem-solve.

#### • Permissive

Parents are warm and loving but provide little structure or guidance. Parents are lenient, giving in to children's demands and rarely enforce rules and limits. Parents tend to adopt a friend role and do not sanction children even when behaviour is harmful to others.

**Outcome -** Children grow up feeling loved but are insecure due to lack of boundaries, likely to struggle academically, lack appropriate behaviour and self-discipline and may report feeling sad.

#### • Uninvolved/neglectful

Parents have little involvement with their child, often not meeting a child's basic needs.

**Outcome** - Children have low self-esteem, perform poorly in school, have behavioural problems and rank low in happiness.

Catching up with Mrs Robyn Lloyd, mum of 3 and foster carer, Mrs Lloyd explains how she uses an authoritative parenting style.

"When we have new little people join our family, they generally have not experienced any boundaries. At first, they may scream (quite loudly), voicing their objection to having boundaries placed on them."

"At times it can be so hard not to just give in to what they want, but keeping in mind that standing firm is what's best for them, in the long run, is so helpful. One of the amazing parts of fostering is seeing the positive impact giving them a predictable, loving and safe environment. The smiles are priceless."





# **Infection Control**

ental health care providers have a duty of care to sterilise instruments between patients and to maintain a clean infectionfree environment. Not only do instruments have to be sterilised, maintenance of these records is a way of documenting how compliant surgeries are with infection control guidelines.

The gold standard way to prove dental instruments are sterilised and the process is verifiable is via a process called instrument tracking.

All dental instruments that are used for invasive procedures are sterilised by means of heat and pressure in hospital-grade autoclaves. An autoclave is a machine used to sterilise instruments. Once instruments are used, if they are not disposed of, they are cleaned by several processes before being wrapped or bagged in sterilisable pouches. These instruments are then placed into the autoclave where the desired temperature and pressure to destroy the nastiest of

bacteria and viruses is reached, and held there for a prescribed period of time.

Autoclaves are tested before every cycle to ensure they are functioning properly. Every load of instruments placed into an autoclave is numbered and correlates with the successful running cycle of the autoclave. This ensures all instruments are sterile and the instruments can be 'tracked', that is, we can tell when instruments were sterilised and document the successful nature of the process.

Instrument tracking is another way that accredited dental practitioners work to ensure the safety of the public. Instrument tracking ensures the utmost safety for all concerned, from the dental team using the instruments to the patients who are receiving treatment.

Although time-consuming and expensive to perform, instrument tracking in a well-equipped and staffed dental practice is part of the daily routine.

## **Spiced Blue Mussels** in Coconut Milk

ussels are miniature morsels of deliciousness that pack a punch. With the ability to carry a variety of flavours, from light and subtle to rich and creamy, the options are endless. This month, why not try out this simple yet delicious recipe from the Sydney Seafood School that is guaranteed to be a weeknight winner!

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup coconut milk
- · Pinch castor sugar
- 1kg blue mussels, scrubbed and debearded
- 1 tablespoon fish sauce
- 1 lime, juiced, plus extra for serving
- Steamed jasmine rice, for serving


#### Spice Paste Ingredients

- 4 cloves garlic, chopped
- 4cm knob ginger, chopped
- · 2 medium red chillies, seeded and chopped
- 2 stalks lemongrass, white part only, finely chopped
- 4 red shallots, chopped (see notes)
- 2.5cm piece turmeric, grated

Make Spice Paste: place garlic, ginger, chilli, lemongrass, shallot and turmeric into a food processor and blend into a paste, adding a little thick coconut milk if necessary to help it blend.

#### Method

- 1. Heat 2 tablespoons of thick coconut milk in a wok, add Spice Paste and cook for about 5 minutes, until aromatic and oily.
- 2. Add sugar and remaining coconut milk and bring to the boil.
- 3. Add mussels, cover, and cook for a minute or 2, until shells start to open. As each shell opens remove it to a large serving bowl.
- 4. When all mussels have opened, stir fish sauce and lime juice through the sauce, pour over mussels and serve with rice.


